Seniors First provides:

- Door-to-Door Rides – transportation for medical appointments, banking, shopping, etc.
- Friendly Visitor Program – weekly social visits
- Health Express – medical transportation
- SeniorLink – information and assistance
- Home Modification & Safety Repairs – handy person provides health and safety repairs that are needed around the home
- Housing Placement Assistance – free assistance with finding the right options for appropriate out-of-home living for a loved one
- Meals on Wheels – currently 350-500 meals are delivered per weekday
- Senior Nutrition: Senior Café – nine locations including tot in Auburn, four in Roseville, and one each in Rocklin, Lincoln and Colfax
- Vial of Life – enables emergency responders to quickly locate helpful information regarding your medical history
- Volunteer Opportunities – for you to enhance not only your own life, but someone else's as well.
- Notary Services (this is a fee service)

That's one reason Kiwanis International has joined in a memorandum of understanding with Boys & Girls Clubs of America to foster, nurture, and establish a legacy of serving children, a cornerstone mission for both organizations. If you don't already have a relationship with a Kiwanis club or a Boys & Girls Club, now's a great time to explore opportunities to work together to benefit area children.

Partnership tips

Boys & Girls Clubs of America and Kiwanis International both have a long history of serving children. Here are some suggestions for continuing that tradition together.

Kiwanis clubs can...

- Bring volunteers and funds to Boys & Girls Clubs - and make an impact on children in need.
- Begin a [Read Around the World](#) program at a Boys & Girls Club.
 - Stock a club or school library.
 - Donate books.
 - Read to kids.
- Introduce [BUG and Terrific Kids](#) programs, which could be an enhancement to Boys & Girls Club programs.
- Schedule a speaker. Invite a representative from Boys & Girls Club to speak to your club during one of your regular meetings. When speakers visit, invite them to join your club. In fact, you can invite Boys & Girls Club members, parents, and staff to become Kiwanis members.
- Propose and fund a Kiwanis-sponsored playground or sports field for a local Boys & Girls Club.
- Hold Kiwanis meetings at a local Boys & Girls Club.
- Encourage Boys & Girls Club members to participate in [Kiwanis One Day](#).
- Coach or referee at a Boys & Girls Club [sports program](#).
- Participate in Boys & Girls Clubs' [Youth of the Year](#) program. As part of the program, every Boys & Girls Club selects a Youth of the Month and a Youth of the Year. The top five winners go to Washington DC, and one Youth of the Year is named. Typically, young people overcome overwhelming obstacles to win the title. Here's how Kiwanis members can take part:
 - Serve on a local club selection committee.
 - "Adopt" Youth of the Year candidates and outfit them for success (business suit or dress) and by helping them develop their public speaking skills.
 - Invite a Youth of the Year candidate to speak at a Kiwanis club meeting.
 - Learn more about [character and leadership](#) programs.
- Sponsor a Power Hour—an interactive after-school program that gives Boys & Girls Club members ages 6-17 access to tutoring and help with homework.
 - Serve as tutors.
 - Grant funds to local clubs.
 - Sponsor volunteers.
 - Provide snacks.
 - Host a barbecue or ice cream social.
- Learn more about Boys & Girls Club [education programs](#).
- Visit the Boys & Girls Club to meet the staff and members. Introduce them to Kiwanis.

Boys & Girls Clubs can...

- Involve Kiwanis clubs in their programs and enjoy the support of loyal, committed volunteers, sponsors, and donors.
- Invite Kiwanis members to serve as Boys & Girls Club board members - and potential donors.
- Encourage Kiwanis members to serve as program volunteers.
- Include Kiwanis members as Youth of the Year judges or sponsor/underwriters for Youth of the Year programs.
- Start a Kiwanis Club [Healthy Habits](#) project for kids age 6-17. It's a dynamic wellness program offered in Boys & Girls Clubs that demonstrates how eating right, keeping fit, and forming positive relationships add up to a healthy lifestyle.
- Initiate hands-on service through Kiwanis facility improvement teams.
- Develop a Kiwanis-sponsored Power Hour.
- Invite Kiwanis volunteers to serve at [Boys & Girls Club Day for Kids](#) celebrations.
- Invite Kiwanis to sponsor and build a Kiwanis playground or sports field.
- Introduce [BUG and Terrific Kids](#) programs, which could be an enhancement to Boys & Girls Club programs.
- Consider asking Kiwanis volunteers to help with building maintenance projects such as painting a gym or taking part in a club clean-up.
- Encourage Kiwanis clubs to do more than write a check to the local Boys & Girls Club. Invite them to get involved and engage with Boys & Girls Club members.
- Key Club is a Kiwanis-family program for high school students. If there's a Key Club nearby, consider offering your club as place for community service projects. Engage Key Clubbers in sports programs and special events.
