I look forward to working with all of these groups throughout the year.

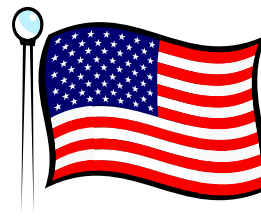

Robert R. Ferber, Sr, PhD grew up in Pittsburgh,
Pennsylvania and attended Pitt and Carnegie Mellon
Universities for his undergraduate and graduate
degrees. He is retired from a 50 year career with
WRS Motion Picture Laboratory, Westinghouse
Electric and NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

During his stay at Westinghouse in Pittsburgh, most
of his research was related to advanced energy
storage and conversion technologies. He came to
the West coast in 1977 to lead research at JPL in
advanced energy conversion technologies,
specifically to manage the collector R&D for
terrestrial photovoltaic power.

During his 28 year career at JPL, he managed
several major energy conversion and energy storage
activities, which utilized his background in
electrical engineering, semiconductor physics and
nuclear physics. Since retirement from JPL, he
moved to Auburn and set up a part time consulting
business in technical project management.



The first Kiwanis motto, "We Build," was adopted in 1920. It was proposed by Roe Fulkerson, first editor of the Kiwanis Magazine, who later said, "God inspired me to write those two words – We Build. I am prouder of them than any other accomplishment in my life." It was replaced 85 years later.
