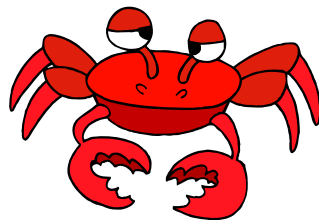

Salvation Army**

Majors Ed and Joyce Loomis have recently relocated to Auburn after 5 ½ years in San Diego. They have been married 36 years. They were happy to share information with us on the Salvation Army serving Auburn with “Heart to God and Hand to Man”.

The Salvation Army of Auburn provides assistance to people in need seven days a week, 365 days a year. It meets community needs in many areas. In the past year the organization has:

- Provided \$635,611 in direct assistance to individuals and families:
- Provided 26,630 grocery bags;
- Provided more than 67,754 meals, and
- Provided assistance to intervene and prevent homelessness totaling more than \$78,460
- Provided transportation for 447 people
- Sent 25 children to summer camp
- Provided 7,638 nights of lodging
- Offered special services to seniors
- Provided medical prescriptions for 45 people
- Provided more than \$63,726 for utility bills to help 356 families.

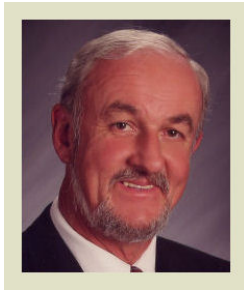

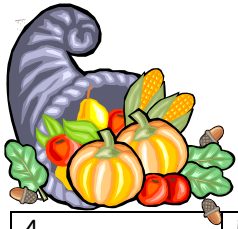



Until 1962, Kiwanis clubs were limited to the United States and Canada. But club delegates to the 1961 convention in Toronto approved the extension of Kiwanis to the rest of the world. In April 1962, the Kiwanis Club of Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, became the first club to be organized outside the two founding nations. Today, Kiwanis clubs are active in more than 70 nations and geographic areas.
