Back about 56 B.C. Julius Caesar wrote: "*Omnia Gallia in tres partes est divisa.*" "All of Gaul is divided in three parts".

In 2010 Cal-Nev-Ha District writes all of Cal-Nev-Ha District is divided in five parts for the Clyde L. Hurley Newsletter Award.

Those parts are:

1. White (for clubs with 30 or fewer members)
2. Blue (31-45 members)
3. Orange (46-70 members)
4. Silver (71- 100 members)
5. Gold (101 or more members).

In Division 44 here is the breakdown of our 15 clubs:

1. White, 5 clubs 33.3%
2. Blue, 6 clubs 40.0%
3. Orange, 3 clubs 20.0%
4. Silver, 1 club 6.7%
5. Gold, no clubs.

In the Cal-Nev-Ha District here is the breakdown of its 517 clubs as of August 31, 2010:

1. White, 319 clubs 61.7%
2. Blue, 103 clubs 19.9%
3. Orange, 67 clubs 13.0%
4. Silver, 22 clubs 4.3%
5. Gold, 6 clubs 1.2%

## Ask Alan Penn



What is your guidance to the 2010-2011 President-elects for the coming year? (in other words, what should they be doing now to prepare for the time they become presidents?)

The most important year in the life of a club leader is their time in preparation for the Presidency. Good preparation as a club president elect will always result in a smooth and effective year as president. But what should a president elect do to prepare?

The strength of our Kiwanis organization is that we have a number of activities and educational tools that help prepare an individual for their year as president.

It all begins with participation at the Kiwanis International (KI) Club Leadership Education (CLE) program. The nuts and bolts of good club operation and governance are key components that are included in this educational program.

Supplement the CLE program with our KI online educational units. You can access at anytime.

Attend one of our KI Webinars. Topics which are germane to your year as president can be found.

Meet with your current club president and immediate past president. Ask for their advice and counsel. They can help you avoid the pitfalls of Kiwanis leadership.

Meet with your Lt. Governor. A good resource for your year as president.

Once you have gathered information, attended CLE, reviewed your club goals and projects, you are ready to put your plan for success as club president into place.

Develop a plan of action complete with those who will serve with you as Board of Directors, as officers, and as committee members.

Develop a calendar of activities so that you and your club stay focused on the goals you have for the club.

Of course there is much more you could do but this is a good start.

Have a great year of service.
